## **Student Reflection Questions**

Is it important for your child/children to do things for others in some sort of formal way?

What service activities would be feasible for your child/children to become involved with?

## **Teacher Reflection Questions**

Does your class/school have an adequate service-learning program either curricular or extra-curricular?

If one is available, does it reach enough students? Are there potential areas for improvement?

If one is not available what activities does your school do that could easily lend itself to adding a service-learning component?
